

Hearing in Consequential Jurisdiction, 9th August, 1912.

No. 63.

Public Prosecutor against Jean Marie Kolas.

The year 1912, 9th August, at 9 am, the Joint Court composed of Messieurs the President, Count de Buena Esperanza; the French Judge, Jean Colonna; the British Judge, A. Alexander; In the presence of the Public Prosecutor, Count d'Audun; Mr. Beugel, Registrar, recording; Sitting in police jurisdiction in public hearing and last resort delivered the following judgment.

The Joint Court

To assign heard the documents in the case read, the Public Prosecutor in his conclusions, the accused in his defence; Considering that from the debates and the depositions of the witnesses heard under oath it is established that Kolas did on the 7th July last sell alcoholic liquor and handed notably a bottle of absinthe to Tom, New Hebrides native, officer provided a panel and punished by articles 57 and 61 of the Constitution of 26 Oct, 1906, 59: "no person shall sell or supply intoxicating liquor to the natives in any form and on any pretext whatsoever" 61: "any breach by non-natives of articles 57, 59... shall be punishable by a fine of from £10 to £20..."

For these reasons:

Condemns Jean Marie Kolas to pay a fine of one pound and cents in the case.
